Central Coast Local Health District (CCLHD) provides community nursing and allied health services as part of the Commonwealth Home Support Programme (CHSP).

CHSP services, along with many other aged care services, are subsidised by the Australian Government.

There is a requirement that CHSP providers, such as CCLHD, work towards collecting client contributions for the services they provide.

Clients currently receiving community nursing or allied health services provided by CCLHD are not required to pay fees.

However, clients are encouraged to make a contribution towards the cost of the services they receive.

Clients will not be denied services because they are unable to make a contribution.
