General Information

What is Maruma-Li?

Maruma-Li is a place for people who are struggling with alcohol and or other drug use.

Maruma-Li is a Medically Assisted Unit that provides a comfortable, safe place to **withdraw** (detox) from alcohol and other drugs. Drug and alcohol treatment services are confidential.

Maruma-Li is located in the grounds of Wyong Hospital on the Central Coast of NSW. The unit has:

- 15 single bed rooms.
- · 8 bathrooms.
- · dining and lounge common areas.
- · a large garden courtyard.

Admission to Maruma-Li is voluntary.

Smoking is not permitted, however NRT (Nicotine Replacement Therapy) is provided.





What to expect

Withdrawing from alcohol or other drugs can cause mild to severe symptoms. This can depend on what type of drug is being used, how long its been used, as well as a persons physical and mental wellbeing. For this reason treatments can be different.

Maruma-Li clients are assessed on admission and a treatment plan is made. A stay can vary from 3–14 days but generally will be about 5 days. Doctors and nursing staff are available to provide treatment and support to clients 24 hrs a day throughout their stay.

Is there a cost?

If you provide a current Australian Medicare card there is no cost for staying in Maruma-Li.

Are there conditions?

The short answer is ves.

Maruma-Li must be a safe and supportive place for all clients and the staff. Some things you should be aware of are:

- Admission to Maruma-Li is voluntary and a person will not be forced to stay against their will.
 However, when a person enters Maruma-Li they are expected to stay within the unit until discharge.
 Periods of leave aren't allowed.
- Visitors and personal phone calls aren't permitted during the stay.
- Smoking isn't allowed but, Nicotine Replacement Therapy (NRT) is provided if you choose.

A full list of the conditions of entry must be agreed to before entering the unit. Please call the Drug and Alcohol Intake Officer for a full explanation of conditions. The Intake Officer can answer any other questions you might have.
